They are in great need of exhibits for their show on October 6 & 7 (2007). They use 9-page frames (for 8 ½ x 11 pages). Maximum is 15 frames (or 135 pages total). INVITATION FROM SOPEX: Through Nancy Swan's efforts WE has been invited to hold a satellite meeting at SOPEX 2008 (Southern Oregon Philatelic Society's show and bourse), being held again at the Padgham Pavillion at EXPO in Central Point, OR. Dates are April 5 & 6, 10-5:30 and 10-4. It's an open show with prospectus available late this fall. They will be showing in 12 page frames. There will be 12-14 dealers. Nick Follansbee, show chair, is happy to welcome a WE satellite meeting, which will probably be around noon on April 6.

INVITATION FROM COALPEX: Through Vesma Grinfeld's efforts comes this info: COALPEX 2008, which will be held June 14 and 15 in Walnut Creek, California, is proud to host WE (Women Exhibitors), a growing group of philatelists with the goal of encouraging more women collectors to take up or improve their philatelic exhibiting. The exhibition will be restricted to women exhibitors who need not belong to WE. There are 50 frames available. In consideration of others who may wish to participate, it is suggested that exhibits be limited to 5 frames or less. Special awards are available for novice exhibitors and "brand new" exhibits. Previous WSP Gold Medal exhibits will be judged head-to-head in a "best of the best" competition; all others will compete for the usual five medal levels and other awards. APS accredited judges will provide written feedback to all who exhibit. **Prospectus & Rules and Regulations appear at the end of this newsletter (pp. 7 & 8)**. <u>THIS MONTH'S TOPIC</u>: Do you belong to a local stamp club(s)? Which one(s)? Do you find support/encouragement for exhibiting? Do others in the club(s) exhibit? Describe meetings, including good and bad points. Is membership a useful experience? Do you attend regularly?

(**Dalene Thomas**) My experiences with the local clubs in Denver have given me great hope that women are becoming more accepted as serious collectors. I had belonged to a small local club for years with no evidence of discrimination. However, until a few years ago, women were not invited to become members of the Collectors Club of Denver. I became the second women to be invited to join and there are now three of us who belong to this prestigious group. The amazing thing is that I was chosen to serve as president two years ago. It has been an interesting tenure, and I won't say that there aren't still some who frown on having women in the group, but mostly it has been a rewarding experience.

I also ran for the board of the Rocky Mountain Philatelic Library last year. This, too, has been an all male group, but I believe so strongly in the library that I wanted to be active in the decision-making part of the organization. I was fortunate to have won a seat on the board, but the down side was that I beat out a very good friend by just a few votes. He has been most gracious about it, but it did make me uncomfortable. I guess as we become more assertive we have to be willing to accept the consequences of those actions.

(Anne Harris) I belong to the Inland Empire Philatelic Society and am its vice president and exhibits chair. We have a few exhibitors in the club, including Jim Graue, Inge Fisher, Howard Ness, John Arn, myself, Gordon Wright and a few of our youth club members. We have two meetings a month except December (our Christmas party) and July (our picnic). The first one is the board meeting and the second the general meeting. At all but two of the general meetings, we have an auction and a speaker. At those two exceptions (we have a huge auction only. Our youth group meets on the second Saturday of each month. We also have joint meetings with the Missoula, MT club at a half-way point in Idaho and a joint meeting with the Tri-Cities club at a half-way point in Washington. At both the joint meetings there is a silent auction, live auction and a dinner. Our get-together in Moses Lake, WA, draws collectors from all over the Northwest. There we have four speakers, a lunch, a dinner and both a live and silent auction. We put on a bourse in the spring. In the fall is our show and bourse. Yes, membership is very useful. I attend both meetings each month and all the other festivities.

(**Barb Harrison**) I joined the local club, Coryell's Ferry Stamp Club, just a year ago. Although there are only a few women, I felt an immediate welcome into the small but friendly club. There are no other exhibitors, but they seem interested that I enjoy exhibiting and invited me to present a program on exhibiting.

We meet twice monthly, at 2 locations. Each has a short business meeting followed by either a show and tell and an auction, or a program such as a speaker or APS slide program followed by an auction. Some members attend both meetings, others attend the one closer to their home. As with many clubs, the average age is probably 65 or over. I personally enjoy the show and tell because of the great variety of material that is shared. The speakers and slide shows have also been excellent, and I'm learning things about areas I wouldn't otherwise discover. For these reasons, plus the opportunity to talk with other collectors, I feel membership is valuable and I therefore attend regularly.

I am also a member of the Merchantville Stamp Club but because of distance can only attend their annual show and dinner. The group is quite large, very active and friendly, and has an excellent newsletter. I'm told that by entering my exhibits in their show, their members are being encouraged to create new exhibits. I have found some nice material, at excellent prices, at their bourse.

I have attended a few meetings of the Hamilton Township Stamp Club, which is a large, active club, and found it to be a great group. They have an excellent newsletter, which is now sent via e-mail. I was the only woman there, but they certainly made me feel welcome. Unfortunately, it's too far away to join.

COMMENTS ON OUR SATELLITE MEETINGS:

(Reported by Janet Klug) Six women and one man attended the WE meeting at INDYPEX, conducted by Janet Klug and Ann Triggle. In attendance: Dottie Winter & Marge Faber (WE members) Paula Sager, Bonnie Lyons, Deb Nicoll, Joyce Adams. David McNamee invited the women to exhibit at COALPEX in an all-women show next year (see full details in June newsletter, Vol. 1-5). Meeting opened with a very short PowerPoint presentation on "Why We Collect" that Janet had done for Summer Seminar. It was just for fun, and those present had said they wanted to see it. General discussion followed, which included: Dealers who intimidate women; Starting an exhibit; Whether or not having a women's exhibiting group was discriminatory to men; Using computers for exhibits and how women who are not computer literate could use a computer. With this last comment, Janet showed some pages she had done using Microsoft Publisher and explained a tiny bit on how to do it. This seemed to interest the ladies present, and one suggested that perhaps WE could generate instruction especially for other WE members on how to do this, as well as make up some templates that can be used and modified for exhibits. Janet has offered to develop a PowerPoint presentation and templates, perhaps in time for AMERISTAMP EXPO, should the WE family find this a useful method to help other women exhibitors.
