## **\*\*\*\*\*UPCOMING SHOWS\*\*\*\*\***

**COALPEX:** COALPEX 2008 (June 14-15) in Walnut Creek, CA, will host a WE satellite meeting (Vesma Grinfelds). The exhibition is restricted to women exhibitors who need not belong to WE. There are 50 frames, and special awards are available for novice exhibitors and “brand new” exhibits. Previous WSP Gold Medal exhibits will be judged head-to-head in a “best of the best” competition; all others will compete for the usual five medal levels and other awards. APS accredited judges will provide written feedback to all who exhibit. **THIS MONTH'S TOPIC:** What are your favorite “tools” for mounting material on your exhibit pages? Do you have any special helpful hints or suggestions?

**(Barb Harrison)** One of my favorite tools is a Fiskars 12” paper trimmer, which I use for cutting all my mats. It’s easy to handle, cuts smoothly, doesn’t take up much space, was fairly inexpensive (probably under \$30), and the replacement blade can be replaced very easily. Other goodies in my mounting box include ZIG 2 Way Glue (Squeeze & Roll), which is acid free and can provide either a permanent bond or a temporary bond – makes it easy to remount items mounted on mats. I also find a lot of use for a pair of very sharp scissors and a thin metal letter opener (which I use to remove mounted items when re-doing pages). When I’m working on PPC exhibits I use lots of transparent photo safe photo corners for mounting the PPC to the mat. Sometimes it’s hard to slide the corner of the PPC into the mount while the mount is still on the strip, so I use a large straight pin to open up the mount so I can slide the PPC corner into the mount without damaging the PPC. I keep several pins stuck in the box of photo corners so I always know where they are. I also use the photo corners for mounting certain pieces of ephemera in display exhibits.

Another favorite is the extra large mounting corners (2” gummed corner mounts), which I use for covers, large/thick pieces of ephemera, etc. They are available from Leonard Hartman, [Leonard@pbbooks.net](mailto:Leonard@pbbooks.net).

Occasionally my printer will dribble a speck of ink on an otherwise good page. In order to salvage the page I keep both white and buff colored Wite Out on hand. If you’re careful, a tiny drop will “save the day” and be undetectable.

I also found something called a Coluzzle Cutting System in Michael’s Craft Store. It includes several templates, a cutting mat, a swivel knife, and a craft knife. It does a great job on curves, circles, and odd shapes, and was not expensive.

**AIR TRAVEL INFO:** As many of you know first-hand, flying is becoming more and more of an unpleasant chore. The day we left on vacation was the first day of Delta charging for checking a second bag. The day we returned, we learned that American will now charge for checking the first bag. This, on top of reduced service and barely receiving a tiny snack on flights and less than great meals, when meals are included, seems to add insult to injury. I'm sure most airlines will follow the trend of charging for checked baggage. I imagine it will soon extend to carry-on bags. I have just purchased the largest lightweight carry-on (meets FAA requirements) and will take only the barest of necessities to shows from now on. I suppose I'll limit myself to one entry per show (because of space in the carry-on).

We learned a hard airport lesson: some airlines (United, at least) have closed their passenger information desks in the gate areas. If you have an e-ticket, and need a seat assignment, go directly to the agent collecting boarding passes as passengers board their flight. Don't be timid or they may give your seat to someone else even if you are there within the set timeframe. This just happened to us when they cancelled a flight which had been postponed/postponed/postponed, forcing us to either sleep in the airport or go to a hotel until catching a next-day flight. We ended up paying for a hotel and getting 5 hours sleep after being up for something like 30 hours.

I can just see things like this happening on the way TO a show and missing out on getting your entry in the frames in time!
