I wasn't really impressed; so, you take a stamp, lick it and affix it on an envelope, big deal, I didn't and still don't write letters! What changed my mind was when he brought home a block of four of the American horses. They were pretty and one of the breeds was the American Saddlebred, my favorite breed. I was hooked, and, the first "monster" was created!

Well, I did well for about a year or so, but, then got bored. I had all these stamps of horses and critters in Varios stock sheets in binders and was doing nothing except looking at them every now and then. It was about this time that John Arn, one of our local club members, asked me if I would like to exhibit. I asked him what that was. He told me it was easy, you just put stamps on 16 pieces of paper and put them in a frame and they get judged (this is <u>really</u> simplifing what John, who is a national gold winning exhibitor told me). That first show was PIPEX 1997. I received a certificate of participation, and that was a favor! But, about that time Display class came into being. That interested and intrigued me. So, thanks to John, the second "monster" was born.

Now, the third "monster" has been started. Ruth Caswell asked if I would like to apprentice judge at SEAPEX this year. I hesitated a moment then and said, "Yes." Under the mentoring of Michael Dixon, it was an excellent experience. My application has been sent in, and, I hope will be accepted. I am really looking forward to this new chapter in my philatelic experiences.

If someone had told me in 1995 that I would be exhibiting nationally and beginning to judge, I would have laughed. I am so glad David decided to return to stamp collecting.
